## Yscir Community Council Annual Report Year to 31 March 2024

Yscir Community Council consists of 7 councillors, elected by the local community every 5 years (with an election due in May 2027). The Council meets 6 times a year with additional meetings, if required, to consider planning applications. Although not a member of the council, county councillor lain McIntosh has attended its meetings and been very active in helping the council to get work done by Powys County Council in the area.

Almost all the income of the Council comes through the precept, £5,107 being received in 2023/24. The Council spent £2,827 in 2023/24. The expenditure was lower than budgeted because we currently have no clerk. No concerns were raised by the internal and external audits for the 22/23 year.

We now have a new website where you can find information on council meetings and procedures together with local information.

The Council published its training policy and all the councillors have participated in various courses during the year. Full details of the council policies can be found on our website.

The Council are maintaining 2 defibrillators in the community in Aberbran (outside Ty Torlan) and Battle (opposite Heol y Garreg). In addition, there are defibrillators at Cradoc School (near front entrance) and at Cradoc Golf Club (rear of clubhouse). Speedwatch has continued to try and make the roads safer in our villages.

Addressing Local Concerns: Farmers' Engagement and Road Maintenance



As your Powys County Council representative, I am committed to enhancing the engagement between the authority, our local farmers and all local residents. After hearing from concerned farmers and Young Farmers' Clubs, I have initiated talks with the Council and will be proposing a motion at the next meeting to improve our collaboration with the agricultural community. Additionally, I am addressing a worrying proposal in the Council's latest budget to convert our unclassified minor roads back to unsurfaced tracks, aiming to reduce maintenance costs. I have contacted Cabinet members for clarification and am actively lobbying against this plan to ensure better road maintenance.
