Yscir Community Council Annual Report Year to 31 March 2025

Yscir Community Council consists of 7 councillors, elected by the local community every 5 years (with an election due in May 2027). The Council meets 6 times a year with additional meetings, if required, to consider planning applications. Although not a member of the council, county councillor lain McIntosh has attended its meetings and been very active in helping the council to get work done in the area, by Powys County Council.

Almost all the income of the Council comes through the precept, £1,344 being received in 2024/25. The Council spent £1,749 in 2024/25. The precept and expenditure was low because we currently have no clerk. No concerns were raised by the internal and external audits for the 23/24 year.

The Council are maintaining 2 defibrillators in the community in Aberbran (outside Ty Torlan) and Battle (opposite Heol y Garreg). In addition, there are defibrillators at Cradoc School (near front entrance) and at Cradoc Golf Club (rear of clubhouse). Speedwatch has continued to try and make the roads safer in our villages.


Pontfaen Young Farmers

Internet Connectivity

Back in 2018/19, I was proud to help bring an internet service to our area through Dyfed IT, a project that made a real difference to many homes and businesses in our community. Unfortunately, since Dyfed IT was taken over by Voneus, I've been receiving an increasing number of complaints about poor reliability and delays in resolving technical issues. I want to reassure residents that I'm regularly contacting Voneus to press for quick resolutions to the problems being reported. I fully understand the frustration this is causing, particularly for those who work from home or rely heavily on a stable internet connection.

In response to these ongoing issues, I'm now actively exploring alternative solutions to improve our local internet infrastructure. One promising route is the development of a more reliable full fibre network, and I'm currently working to secure funding that could make this possible. This is very much a team effort. I've been working closely with the five Community Councils in our ward, and we recently held a meeting with a potential service provider. They are now carrying out a scoping exercise to assess the viability of installing a new fibre network in our area. If this proves feasible and we're able to secure the necessary funding, we hope to move forward and deliver a service that meets the needs of our communities for the long term. I'll continue to keep residents updated as this work progresses.

Concerns Over ESTYN Report on Powys Education Service

Like the vast majority of Powys residents, I was deeply alarmed by the recent damning report from ESTYN regarding Powys County Council's education service – particularly its criticism of the service's political leadership. Fellow members of my County Council group and I have been very vocal in calling for urgent change. We believe the current Cabinet structure is not fit for purpose and have insisted that the Council must act swiftly to implement ESTYN's recommendations in full. While the Chief Executive has taken the step of establishing an 'Accelerated Improvement Board' to begin addressing some of the issues raised, it is telling that this has been done without the involvement of the current Cabinet Member for Education. Despite this, there has still been no indication of any changes being made at Cabinet level. I will continue to press for meaningful reform and accountability to ensure our children receive the standard of education they need and rightly deserve.
